Chains Sept 8: At 7^h 40^m a. m.
l. m. t., we set off 39° 4'
on the lat. arc; 5° 44'
N. on the decl. arc; and
determine a meridian
with the solar at the
N. E. cor. of T. 14 N., R. 26
E. which is a cor.
common to the two
Tps. 14 and 15 N., R. 26 E.
Thence we run

N. on a random line on
E. bdy. of T. 15 N., R. 26 E.
with the following result.
