

Subdivision of T. 15 N., R. 27 E.
 Chainis since July 12, 1904
 and know them to be
 correct.

Sept 9: At 7^h 15^m a.m., l.
 m. l., I set off $39^{\circ} 4'$ on
 the lat. arc; $5^{\circ} 22' N.$ on the
 decl. arc; and determined
 a meridian with the solar,
 at cor. of secs. 35, 36, 1 and 2.
 which we established
 on S. bdy of Tp. Aug. 6, 1904.
 The mean magnetic declination
 was $17^{\circ} 30' E.$

Thence we run
 $N. 0^{\circ} 1' W.$ bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over slightly rolling ground.
 Set a redwood post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins.
 sq., with marked stone, 24 ins
 in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
 marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 35-on W. and 36
 on E face; dig pits 18x18x12
 ins. N. and S. of post, 3 ft. dist.;
 and raise a mound of
 earth, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base $6\frac{1}{2}$
 ft. high, W. of
 cor.
