

Resurvey of the E. Bdy. T. 26 N. R. 28 E.

Chains July 7, 1905

From the standard T. cor of T. 26 N. R. 28 and 29 E. heretofore described I run N. on a random line to locate the cor. on the E. bdy. of T. 26 N. R. 28 E.

40.00 Trace of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears E. 1.53 chs. dist.

80.00 After diligent search I fail to find trace of sec. cor.

120.00 No trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

162.00 An old sec. cor. presumably a temp. cor. bears E. 2.00 chs. dist.

200.00 Fail to find trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

240.00 No sign of sec. cor.

280.00 No sign of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

320.00 Find no trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

400.00 Find a granite stone in mound of stone mtd. with 1 notch on N. and 5 notches on S edges. bears E. 2.16 chs.

440.00 No trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

484.50 Intersect S. bdy. T. 27 N. R. 29 E. at 8.36 chs. E. of the cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 N. Rqs. 28 and 29 E. A stone mtd. and retained as described by notes of the Surveyor General.
