Survey Commenced April 5, 1905 and executed with a Leitz transit No 1882 the horizontal limb having two double verniers placed opposite to each other and reading to 1' of an arc.

The instrument was examined and tested on the true meridian at San Francisco and found Correct as per Certificate dated Aug. 19, 1904.

Reference is made to the field notes of the Resurvey of the S. bay of this tp. for a record of the observation from which these lines were deflected.

Starting at the Cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35² & 36 on S. bay of tp. established by me and previously described, I run

North bet. Secs. 35² & 36

descending

- 2.50 ravine 5 lks wide Course $N75^{\circ}W$. and ascend
 4.05 top of ridge bears $N70^{\circ}W$ and $S70^{\circ}E$. and descend
 20.13 ravine 5 lks. wide Course $N35^{\circ}E$. and descend
 31.10 Same ravine 10 lks. wide Course $N50^{\circ}W$.
 39.76 ravine 25 lks wide Course $N60^{\circ}W$ and ascend
 40.00 Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. Cor. falls in wash on side of ravine it being an unsuitable place in which to establish a corner. I set witness corner N. 42 lks. dist. A granite stone $16 \times 12 \times 4$ ins. 11 ins. in the ground marked WC $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face raise mound of stone $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high
