Survey Commenced May 1, 1905 and executed with a Leitz transit No 1882, the horizontal limb having two double verniers placed opposite to each other and reading to 1' of an arc.

The instrument was examined and tested on the true meridian at San Francisco and found correct as per Certificate dated Aug. 19, 1904.

I begin at the Cor. of T. 19 and 20 N R 44 and 45 E. previously described, the record of the observation at this Cor. will be found in the field notes of the re-survey of the S. bdy.

Thence I run

North on true line on E. bdy. of township bet. Secs. 31 and 36.

ascending steep broken hills

20.00 descend

38.25 ravine 500. wide course S.E. and ascend

40.51 Set quartz stone 16x8x4 ins. 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face raise mound of stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high N. of Cor.

62.90 Spur bears S.E. and descend

80.51 Set quartz stone 18x7x4 ins. 12 ins. in the ground for Cor. of Secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, marked with 5 notches on N. and 1 notch on S. edge raise mound of stone 4 ft. base 2 ft. high
