## General Description

The land embraced in this township is mountainous and includes the roughest portion of the To-ya-by Range of mountains

The N.E. portion that<sup>is</sup> left unsurveyed is entirely unfit for cultivation being composed of high rugged rocky mountains too steep for cattle to graze on and devoid of valuable timber, the land suitable for cultivation lies along the bed of Kingston & Broad Canons. There are three settlers in the township, Miller whose ranch is situate in Sec. 36, Daniels whose ranch is in Sec. 17 & 20 and is irrigated by the waters of Big
