

Re-survey of N. by T. 19 N. R. 25 E.

Chain Sept 9, 1905

I set off $8^{\circ} 24' N$ on decl. arc and $39^{\circ} 35' N$ on lat. arc and at 8 h. 0 m. a.m. L.M.T. determine a meridian with the solar, at the cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 N., Rgs. 25 and 26 E.

Thence I run

West on a blank line in search of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. and sec. cor.

40.21 I find $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. 64 lks. N. of line which is a lava rock $18 \times 8 \times 6$ ins. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, loosely set in a mound of stone.

80.28 I find a lava stone $20 \times 10 \times 8$ ins. 1.14 chs. N. of line, mkd. with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edges, set in a mound of stone.

120.34 I find $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. a lava stone $16 \times 14 \times 8$ ins. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, faintly, 1.74 chs. N. of line in a mound of stone.
