

Res. Tract W bdy. T25 N. R. 30 E.

Claims

From the ^{October 19, 1905} cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12 on the W. bdy of T25 N. R. 30 E. which is a sandstone 14x10x8 ins. above ground firmly set and witnessed, and marked as deacred. by the Surveyor general. I retrac south bet secs. 7 and 12 and at 40.10 chs. the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. a volcanic stone, 18x6x5 ins. set in a mound of stone, bears E. 60 lks. dist. and at 80.06 chs. the cor. secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, a volcanic stone 18x8x4 ins. set in a mound of stone bears E. 62 lks. dist. 120.16 the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. a volcanic stone 18x6x5 ins. set in a mound of stone bears E. 53 lks. distant and at 160.28 the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, which is a sandstone 18x12x5 ins. above ground, mtd with 3 notches on N and S edges, pits and mound nearly obliterated bears E. 26 lks.

As this corner will be common to secs. 13 and 24 only, I dig pits 24x24x12 ins. in each sec. NW and SW of Cor. 6 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth 4 ft. base 2 ft. high. W. of cor.

Thence I run

✓ N 0° 23' E on a true line along the E. bdy of sec. 13 over rolling land.
