

## Resurvey of Subdivision of Subdivision T24N R29E

Chain

Survey commenced May 15, 1906  
 from the cor. of sec. 1, 2, 3, 5 and 86  
 on the N. Edge of T24N R. 29 E heretofore  
 described. Latitude  $32^{\circ}56'$  N. Mean Mag. Dec.  $17^{\circ}58'$  E.  
 Run.

South on a blank line 68.25 sec.

1 and 2

The old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. a trap stone  $10 \times 6 \times 4$  in. properly marked and lying on a mound of earth pits obliterated bears 2 lbs. W.

80.53

A volcanic stone  $9 \times 5 \times 4$  in. above ground properly marked <sup>for cor. of sec. 1, 2, 11 and 12</sup> with a few scattering stones lying around it. bears N. 5 lbs. dist.

I continue my line south and search for corners at 40 and 80 chain intervals but fail to find any trace of old corners. and at a point 120.00 chs. south of the corner of sec. 1, 2, 11 and 12 set a pin post 3 ft. long 4 in. sq. with marked stone 2 4 in. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec cor marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 14 on W and 13 on E face. dig pits  $18 \times 18 \times 12$  in N and S. of post 3 ft. dirt and raise a mound of earth 3 1/2 ft. base 1 1/2 ft. high N. of cor.

Thence I run

on a true line  
 North to the sec. 10 corner
