Chains.	
3.51	Dry creek bed, course E. 30 ft. below sec. cor.; ascend.
19.00	Top of ridge, 200 ft. above creek bed, bears E. and W.; descend.
27.40	Ravine, 50 ft. below top of ridge, course E.; ascend.
33.00	Top of spur, 150 ft. above ravine, bears N.E. and S.W.; gradually descend 10 ft. to
40.00	Set a granite stone 13x9x7 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ on W. face; and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor. Pits impracticable.
42.50	Descend rapidly 100 ft. to
49.77	Cornwall Basin creek, 5 lks. wide, flows S. 50° E.; ascend.
60.00	Top of spur, 50 ft. above creek, slopes S.W.; thence gradually ascend.
64.00	Spring, 2 chs. W. of line, flows S.
76.00	Spring, 1 ch. W. of line, flows S.
79.25	Intersect N. bdy. of Tp. 3.62 chs. N. 89° E. of the cor. of secs. 35 and 36.
	At the point of intersection, set a quartzite stone, 13x10x6 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, marked C C on S.; with 1 groove on E., and 5 grooves on W. face; and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor. Pits impracticable.
