 on the Third Standard Parallel South, marked S C 12 S  
 on N., R. 48 E. on E., and R. 47 E. on W. faces, with  
 6 grooves on N. E. and W. faces, and raise a mound of  
 stone 4ft. base 2ft. high N. of cor. Pits impract-  
 icable.
