CHAINS

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd. rate.

No timber.

Mountainous land on 80.00 chs.

October 28, 1906.

EAST BOUNDARY OF T.4 S., R.47 E.

October 29: At 7h.44m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off 37°30'N., on lat.arc, 13°15'S. on decl.arc, and determine a meridian with the solar at the standard cor. of Tps. 4 S., Rs. 47 and 48 E., heretofore described.

Thence I run

North, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Ascend over rolling, rocky land, through dense undergrowth.

3.00 Ridge, bears E. and W.

6.95 From this point, the shaft of the Cactus Peak Mine, bears W. 23.00 chs. dist., Wilson's Camp, composed of 5 tents, lies N.W. of shaft about 6.00 chs. dist.

15.00 Hollow, 75 ft. deep, course E.

Ascend.

33.00 Ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend.

39.00 Hollow, 75 ft. deep, course E.

Ascend.

40.00 Set a basalt stone, 18x14x4 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4 on W. face, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

80.00 Set a basalt stone, 18x12x4 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25-30-31 and 36, marked with 1 notch on S. and 5 notches on N. edges, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

Land, rolling.

Soil, rocky, 3rd. rate.
