GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The south western portion of this township lies in Cactus Flat, the soil of which is sandy and covered with a dense growth of desert brush, while the balance of the township falls on Kawich Mountains, the soil of which is rocky and broken by many deep hollows and covered with a scattering growth of cedar and pinon timber. There are several springs in this township but they cannot be located from any point along the boundaries. There are no indications of mineral found in this township.
