

## SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T.5 N., R.49½ E.

## CHAINS

West, bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Ascend over mountainous land.

- 23.50 Begin abrupt ascent over broken basalt ledges, bearing N. and S.
- 40.00 Set a basalt stone, 15x10x4 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. face, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.  
Pits impracticable.
- 80.00 Set a basalt stone, 12x10x6 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 2-3-34 and 35, marked with 2 notches on E. and 4 notches on W. edges, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.  
Pits impracticable.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky, 3rd. and 4th. rate.  
No timber.  
Mountainous land on 80.00 chs.

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West, bet. secs. 3 and 34.

Ascend abruptly over broken basalt ledges.

- 25.92 Intersect E. bdy. of T.5 N., R.49 E., 26.90 chs. S. of the cor. of secs. 25-30-31 and 36, which is a granite stone, 12x8x8 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.  
Set a basalt stone, 18x10x4 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of Tps. 4 and 5 N., R.49½ E., marked C C 49½ E on E., 4 N on S., and 5 N on N. with 6 grooves on N., S. and E. faces, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, E. of cor.  
Pits impracticable.  
I destroy all marks on the cor. of secs. 25-30-31 and 36, T.5 N., Rs. 49 and 50 E., that pertains to R.50 E.  
Land mountainous.
