

CORRECTIVE NOTES OF THE MOUNT DIABLO BASE, through R. 51½ E.

CHAINS

Pits impracticable.

Difference between measurement of 80.00 chs. by two sets of chainmen is 8 lks., position of middle point

By 1st. set, 80.04 chs.,

By 2nd. set, 79.96 chs., the mean of which is

80.00 At a point 62.60 chs. South of the SW. cor. of T. 1 N., R. 52 E.

Set a granite stone, 15x12x6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for southeast cor. of T. 1 N., R. 51½ E., on Mount Diablo Base, marked SC 1 N on N.,

51½ E on W., with 6 grooves on N. and W. faces, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

Land, rolling.

Soil, granite debris, 3rd. rate.

No timber.

Undergrowth, shad scale.

Dense undergrowth on 80.00 chs.


I destroy all corners set on the Mount Diablo Base, through R. 51½ E., which were set on the original survey.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Mount Diablo Base, through R. 51½ E., is situated in Reveille Valley, on the western side of Reveille mountains.

The soil is a granite debris covered with a dense growth of shad scale and bunch grass.

There are no springs, settlements or mining claims along this line.
