

CORRECTIVE NOTES OF

EAST BOUNDARY OF T.3 N., R.51½ E.

CHAINS

September 13: 1909: At 7h.56m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off 38°02' N. on lat. arc, 3°55' N., on decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of Tps. 2 and 3 N., R.51½ E., Thence I run

North, along the E. bdy. of sec. 36.

Ascend over mountainous land.

17.00 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.

Descend.

35.00 Hollow, 75 ft. deep, course SE.

Ascend.

38.00 Spur, projects E.

Descend.

40.00 Set a basalt stone, 18x10x8 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ on W. face, from which, A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 50°45' W., 246 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 36 BT.

No other trees within limits, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor. Pits impracticable.

48.00 Spur projects E. Enter scattering timber. Descend.

51.00 Hollow, 75 ft. deep, course E.

Ascend.

56.00 Spur, projects E.

Descend.

59.00 Hollow, 75 ft. deep, course SE.

Ascend.

80.00 Set a basalt stone, 15x10x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25 and 36, T.3 N., R.51½ E., marked with 1 notch on S. and 5 notches on N. edges, from which

A cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 12°40' W., 150 lks. dist., marked T 3 N R 51½ E S 36 BT.

A cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 36° W., 169 lks. dist., marked T 3 N R 51½ E S 25 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd. rate.

Timber, cedar and pinon.
