

EAST BOUNDARY OF T.3 N., R.51 E.

CHAINS

Mountainous land on 80.00 chs.

North, bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Descend over rocky and mountainous land.

40.00 Set a basalt stone, 15x10x5 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

52.00 Hollow, 150 ft. deep, course NW.

Abrupt ascent.

107.00 Ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend.

114.00 Hollow, 100 ft. deep, course W.

Ascend.

121.00 Ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend.

126.00 Hollow, 150 ft. deep, course W.

Abrupt ascent.

133.10 Intersect S. bdy. of T.4 N., R.51 E., 13.81 chs. E. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 3 and 34, heretofore described.

Set a basalt stone, 18x12x8 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of Tp. 3 N., Rs. 51 and 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., marked

C C 3 N on S., 51 E on W., and 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ E on E., with 6 grooves on S., E. and W. faces, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft.

base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd. and 4th. rate.

No timber.

Mountainous land on 133.10 chs.
