

CORRECTIVE NOTES OF THE WEST BOUNDARY OF T.6 S., R.44 E.

CHAINS

North, bet. secs. 13 and 18.

39.97 Intersect the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

40.00 Set same stone, a basalt stone, 24x10x4 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

I destroy all traces of the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.00 Intersect the cor. of secs. 7-12-13 and 18, described in original field notes.

North, bet. secs. 7 and 12.

40.00 Intersect the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., described in original field notes.

80.00 Intersect the original cor. of secs. 1-6-7 and 12, described in original field notes.

North, bet. secs. 1 and 6

40.00 Intersect the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., described in original field notes.

80.00 Intersect the cor. of Tps. 5 and 6 S., Rs. 43 and 44 E., described in original field notes.

Note:

I carefully rechaind the W. Bdy. of T.6 S., R.44 E. especially bet. secs. 31 and 36, which was reported to be 62 lks. short by the examiner of surveys.

I do not agree in the length of this original line by 32 lks. with the examiner of surveys.
