

WEST BOUNDARY OF T.9 S., R.44 E.

CHAINS

July 4: At 8h.04m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off 36°04'N., on lat. arc, 22°58'N., on decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar, at the cor. of Tps. 9 and 10 S., Rs. 43 and 44 E., heretofore described.

Thence I run

North, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Descend abruptly over rocky and mountainous land.

19.00 Enter hollow, 200 ft. deep, course NE.

32.00 Leave hollow.

Abrupt ascent.

~~40.00 Set a basalt stone, 15x9x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4 on W. face, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.~~

41.80 Ridge, bears E. and W.

Abrupt descent.

47.00 Hollow, 150 ft. deep, course E.

Abrupt ascent.

53.30 Ridge, bears NE. and SW.

Abrupt descent.

69.00 Hollow, 200 ft. deep, course NE.

Abrupt ascent.

74.50 Ridge, bears NE. and SW.

Abrupt descent.

~~80.00 Set a basalt stone, 15x12x7 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25-30-31 and 36, marked with 1 notch on S. and 5 notches on N. edges, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.~~

~~Pits impracticable.~~

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd. rate.

No timber.

Undergrowth, greasewood.

Dense undergrowth on 80.00 chs.
