Survey commenced June 10, 1909, and executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit, as described in Book "A" of the returns of field notes of surveys under this Contract.

The instrument was examined, tested on the true meridian at Reno, Nevada, found correct, and was approved by the Surveyor General for Nevada, May 24, 1909.

I return to the meridian established June 4, 1909, from Polaris, as described in said Book.

At 9 h 00 m A.M., l.m.t., I set off 23°01' N. on decl. arc, and 39°43' N. on lat. arc, and test the adjustments of my solar, finding it gives the same meridian as before, and adjustments correct.

I commence at the cor. of Tps. 21 and 22 N., Rs. 23 and 24 E. heretofore described, and run thence West bet. secs. 1 and 36.

(Angle left 89°52' deflected from my line north) Ascend gradual bench.

40.00 Set a basalt stone 15x12x10 ins. 10 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high N. of cor. Pits impracticable.

80.00 Set a granite stone 16x13x7 ins. 10 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 35 and 36, marked with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edges, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high N. of cor.

Pits impracticable.

Land gradual bench.

Soil, gravelly and stony 2nd and 3rd rates.

No timber.

2.50 West bet. secs. 1 and 35. Intersect the east bdy. of Sec. 2, as run by Deputy Kearney under his contract for surveys of lands lying west of and adjoining the boundary of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation, at a point bearing S. 0° 1' E. 6.40 chs. dist. from the N.E. cor. of said sec. 2.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam. 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 35, marked on brass cap.

S 2 in SW quadrant and S 35 in NW quadrant, and raise a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high W. of post.
