

- Chains May 15, 1908:  
 From the cor. of secs. 3,4,9 and 10, re-established by me  
 ( see book of sub-divisions of Tp.42N.,R.39E. ) I run  
 South on a random line bet. secs. 9 and 10.
- 39.92 The decayed remains of a willow post, mkd. as described  
 by the surveyor general, pits obliterated bears E. 8 lks.
- 79.64 The decayed remains of a willow post, mkd. as described  
 by the surveyor general, pits obliterated bears E. 32 lks.  
 I destroy this cor. and re-establish it in place as  
 follows;-  
 Set a basalt rock 16x8x6 ins., 11 ins. in the ground  
 for cor. of secs. 9,10,15 and 16 , mkd. with 3 notches  
 on the E. and 4 notches on the S. edge; and raise a  
 mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, W. of cor.  
 Pits impracticable. Thence I run  
 N.0°20'W. Over rocky land, gently rolling.
- 00.20 Wire fence bears E. and W.
- 24.80 Wire fence bears E. and W, Enter hay field.
- 34.30 Enter meadow bears E. and W.
- 38.10 Leave meadow, cross creek 5 lks. wide, 1 lk. deep, clear,  
 fresh water, course E.
- 39.72 I destroy the old ¼ sec. cor. and re-establish it in  
 place as follows;-  
 Set a basalt rock 18x9x6 ins., 12 ins. in the ground  
 for ¼ sec. cor., mkd. ¼ on W. face; and raise a mound  
 of stone 3 ft. base. 2 ft. high W. of cor. Pits im-  
 practicable.  
 Thence N.0°07'W.
- 40.50 Wood road bears E. and W.
- 40.80 Wire fence bears E. and W.
- 43.50 Dry run course E.
- 51.30 Low ridge bears E. and W.
- 59.60 Ravine course E.
- 68.10 Low ridge bears E. and W.
- 78.20 Wire fence bears E. and W.
- 79.64 The cor. of secs. 3,4,9 and 10, re-established by me as  
 heretofore described.
