- 28.00 Dry run course E.
- 31.00 Dry run course N.E. ascend to
- 36.10 Ridge bears E. and W. descend
- 39.10 Ravine course E.
- 39.88 Set a hornblende schist rock 18x8x7 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W. face; and raise a mound of stone  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base, 2 ft. high W. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- 42.30 Wood road bears E. and W.
- 46.10 Wood road bears E. and W.
- 48.40 Wood road bears E. and W.
- 52.30 Ridge bears E. and W., descend steep slope.
- 57.00 Deep narrow gulch, course E. ascend steep slope.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

In this Tp. secs. 3, 4, and 9 contain all the agricultural land not previously surveyed. H.A. Gilbert has a small fruit ranch in the S.W. cor. of sec. 3 and in the eastern portion of Sec. 4 along Cotton-wood Creek.

Moses Gilbert has a small hay and produce ranch in the east central part of sec. 9 along a small fresh water creek.

The remainder of the unsurveyed land in this Tp lies on the E. slope of the Cotton-wood range of mountains and is only good for grazing.

No timber with the exception of a few cotton-woods along the creeks.
