General description of Township

This township, so far as surveyed at this time consists of river bottom land and bench land. The river bottom land is especially fertile. The bench land, if irrigated can doubtless be made to produce, but it lies for the most part from 20 to 50 feet above the river, and could not be irrigated without diverting the river several miles higher up the stream. Section 14 is hilly land and unsuited to agriculture.

Note:

We were camped during the time I was working on the survey at a ranch many miles from the office of any Notary Public. Nearly all of the assistants were ranch hands whom I found there and who returned to work on the ranch after the survey was finished. It was impossible to get them together at the office of a Notary Public either before or after the work, so I administered the oaths to the assistants personally.
