

Chains Subdivisions of T. 13 N, R 29 E.

- West on a random line between sections 30 and 31.
- 40.00 Set temporary  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner.
- 78.45 Intersect West boundary of Township 36 links south of  
Secs.  
corner to 25, 30, 31 and 36.
- Thence I run on a true line S.89° 45' E. between sections  
30 and 31.
- 3.45 Road bears NE. and SW.
- 38.45 Set a cottonwood post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. square, with  
marked stone, 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  section  
corner, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 30 on north face and S 31 on the South  
face, and dig pits 18 x 18 x 12 ins. east and west <sup>of cor.</sup> 3  
ft. distant and raise a mound of earth of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base,  
1 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high North of the corner.
- 78.45 Corner to sections 29, 30, 31 and 32.
- Land, level.
- Soil, sandy and 2nd rate.
- No timber.

#### General Description.

This township is, so far as this survey extends, close to the Walker river and is capable of being irrigated therefrom. The soil is sandy, but probably not unproductive. Its convenience to the railroad, to the town of Schurz and the water supply from which it must be irrigated renders it valuable.

We were camped during the time I was working on this survey at a ranch many miles from the office of any Notary Public. Nearly all of the assistants were ranch hands whom I found there and who returned to work on the ranch after the survey was finished. It was impossible to get them together at the office of a Notary Public either before or after the work.
