

Subdivisions of T. 13 N. R. 27 E.

General Description.

This township is extremely mountainous and rough. The part surveyed nearly all slopes to the NE. toward the Walker River and Walker Lake.

There are hundreds of mining claims staked on the sections surveyed and mineral monuments can be seen in every direction. None of these claims, however, have been patented, and although considerable work has been done at different places there are no producing mines in the surveyed portion. There is an assemblage of tents and small houses known as the town of Granite in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 24 where a number of persons live who are working on the surrounding claims. The land is undoubtedly mineral land, entirely unsuited for agriculture and of small value for grazing purposes.

The men who assisted me in this township were nearly all ranch hands, who were at all times a considerable distance from the office of any Notary Public. It was impossible for me to get them together at a Notary Public's office either before or after the work. For that reason I administered the oath to these men myself.
