42.40 Ravine, course NW.,  
 44.15 Road, bears NW. and SE.,  
 56.00 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.,  
 63.70 Ravine, course NW.,  
 64.50 Hollow, course NW.,  
 67.50 Base of ridge, bears NW. and SE.,  
 72.60 Ravine, course NW. Ascend bluff.  
 79.77 Intersect S. bdy. of sec. 7, 1.57 chs. N. 89° 39' W. of  
 cor. of secs. 7, and 8. Set slate rock 24x10x6 ins.,
