

Resurvey of Boundary of T. 14 N. R. 41 E.

Chains

I now go to the cor. of secs., 34, 35, 2, 3 on the S bdy of the township, which is a stone marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Thence I run, E. on line between secs., 2, and 35.

Thence I return to the cor. of Secs. 2, 3, 34 & 35, and at 2h. p.m. 1.m.t., I set off 39° 1' on the lat. arc and 20° N. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar.

Thence I run, E. bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Ridge, bears N.

Summit of rocky ridge, bears N.

Set a granite stone 36x14x8 ins, on ledge rock supported by mound of stone, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft, high N. of cor. Pits impracticable.

A pinon 6 ins. in dia., bears S. 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 67 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 2 B.T.

A pinon 10 ins. in dia. bears N. 83 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 61 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 35, B.T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, stony, 3rd. rate.

Timber, pine, cedar, mahogany, sagebrush.

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber, very difficult to survey, 40.00 chains.
