

Survey of Boundary of T. 14 N. R. 41 E.

Chains	May 24, 1909.
	At the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 2 and 35 on S. bdy.
	I set off $39^{\circ} 1'$ N. on lat. arc and $20^{\circ} 44'$ N. on the decl. arc, and at 8 h a.m. l.m.t., determine a meridian with the solar.
	Thence I run E. bet. secs. 2 and 35.
7.50	Leave trees.
15.00	Enter mahogany thicket.
18.00	Summit of spur, slopes N., Descend.
22.00	Hollow, slopes NW.,
32.80	Summit of spur, bears NW.,
35.90	Hollow, course NW.,
40.00	Set a granite stone $36 \times 12 \times 6$ ins., 27 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 35, 36 1 and 2, marked with 1 notch on E. edge and 5 notches on W. edge, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of cor. Whence
	A pine, 18 ins. diam., bears S. $51\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. 75 lks. dist. marked T. 13 N., R. 41 E. S. 1 B.T.
	A pine 6 ins. diam., bears S. 21° W. 32 lks. dist., marked T. 13 N. R. 41 E, S. 2 B.T.
	A mahogany, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E. 25 lks. dist., marked T. 14 N., R. 41 E. S. 36 B.T.
	A mahogany, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 21° W., 72 lks. dist. marked T. 14 N., R. 41 E., S. 35 B.T.
	Land, mountainous.
	Soil, rocky, third rate.
	Timber, pine cedar, mahogany, sagebrush.
	Mountainous, covered with timber, very difficult to survey, 40 chs.
