General Description.

This township is rough and mountainous in the north-eastern and south western parts, rolling in the other parts, except along the Amargosa and Oasis valleys, which are level. The soil along the valleys is rich, but contains considerable alkali, which can be washed out to a large extent Ay irrigation.

.Water is plentiful along the marshy meadows which contain numerous small springs; and anywhere along the Oasis and Amargosa valleys it may be obtained by sinking a few feet.

There is no timber except four small groves in secs. 14, 31 and 33.

The town of Springdale contains a hotel, two stores, two restaurants, two saloons and about 20 cabins.
