

(16) Survey of S Bdy. T. 35 N., R. 68 E.

- Chains: April 30: I begin at the cor. of Tps. 34 and 35N
Rs. 68 and 69. E., a stone set by me April 5, 1909, and
as I have a meridian established at this cor. from which
to turn, I run:
- West bet. sec. 1 and 36
- Across rolling land
- 25.60 Telephone line, bears N. 39° W., and S. 39° E.
- 31.00 Bottom of terrace, 20 ft. high, bears N. and S., ascend
- 32.50 Top of terrace
- 37.80 Road, bears N. 20° W., and S. 20° E.
- 40.00 Set a lime stone 22x12x8 ins., 16 ins. in the ground
for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face; dig pits 18x18x12
ins. E. and W. of stone, 3 ft. dist., and raise a mound
of earth 3 1/2 ft base, 1 1/2 ft high, N. of cor.
- 80.00 Set a lime stone 20x8x8 ins., 15 ins. in the ground
for cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, marked with 1 notch on
E. and 5 notches on W. edge; raise a mound of stone 3 ft.
base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- Land rolling,
Soil gravelly, 3rd rate.
Growth of sage brush and bunch grass.

- 27.00 Road, bears N. 20 W., and S. 20° E.
- 31.00 Road, bears N. 45° E. and S. 45° W.
- 32.00 Foot of terrace, 30 ft. high, bears N. and S. ascend
- 34.00 Top of terrace
- 40.00 Set a limestone 15x10x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground
for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face; dig pits 18x
18x12 ins., E. and W. of stone 3 ft. dist., raise a mound
of earth 3 1/2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high N. of cor.
- 44.50 Western Pacific R.R. bears N. 12° W., S. 12° E.
- 45.40 Telegraph line, parallel to R.R.
- 75.00 Enter scattering growth of scrub pine and cedar
timber, bears N. and S.
