Chains.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor, bet. secs. 24, and 25 I run,
East on a true line between secs. 24 and 25.

- 1.50 Descend to deep canon.
18.18 Deep Canon and creek, course N.W.
26.97 Draw, course S.
Ascend.
39.17 Intersect the E bdy. of 24 chs, N. of the cor of secs.
19 and 30. I set a quartzite stone, 15x8x6 ins. 10 ins
in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 24 and 25.
marked CC on W. with 2 grooves on the S and 4 grooves
on the N. face; dig pits 24x18x12 ins. crosswise on
each line, N. and S. 3 ft. and W. of stone 7 ft. dist.
and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base 2 ft. high W. of
cor.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, stony and gravelly, second rate.
Timber, Juniper and sagebrush.
Mountainous land 39.17. chains.
