GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The portion of this township surveyed, is situated at the foot of the mountains, a part of it extending on the side of a timbered mountain. It lies on the East side of Pine valley. There are a number of Hot Springs whose sources are in the portion surveyed. The land all slopes to the West. The Valley portions are very fertile, but a scarcity of water, prevents its being taken up by Homesteaders.
