

## Resurvey of S. bdy. of T. 28 N. R 5E E.

Chains.

July 17th. 1909.

At 7 h. 10m. A.M. 1.m.t. I set off 21o 17' N. on the decl. arc, and 40o 14' on the lat. arc and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N. R's 51 and 52 E.

Thence I run,

N. 89o 56' W. bet. secs. 1 and 36.

- 21.42 Begin gradual ascent.
- 30.42 Nose of ridge, bears N. and S.
- 31.92 Small draw, course S.
- 32.72 Small nose, bears N. and S.
- 33.52 Draw, course S.
- 34.42 Nose, bears N. and S.
- 34.92 Draw, course S.
- 35.92 Nose, bears N. and S.
- 37.22 Draw, course S.
- 38.42 Nose, bears N. and S.
- 39.42 Draw. course S.
- 40.19 The old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. bet. secs. 36 and 1. A cedar stake 2 ins. square, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I destroy all traces of the old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. and in the same place I set a pine post 3 ft. long 3 ins square with marked stone, 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 36 on the N. and 1 on the S. face; dig pits 18x18x12 ins. E. and W. of post, 3 ft dist. and raise a mound of earth  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. in base  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high N. of cor.
- 41.00 Small nose, bears N. and S.
- 44.00 Edge of tableland.
- 75.00 Small draw, course S.
- 80.00 Edge of tableland.
- 80.58 The old corner of sections 35, 36, 1 and 2. A cedar stake 3 ins square, lying loose in a mound of earth, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
