

## Survey of N. Boundary of T. 28 N. R. 51 E.

Chains.	
	West bet, secs 6 and 31.
4.00	Summit of Ridge, bears N&S. Descend.
10.00	Still descending.
14, 60	Creek bed in canon, course NE. Ascend.
20.00	Ravine, 5 chains S. and parallel to line.
40.00	Set an andesite stone 16x12x8 ins. 11ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft, high N of cor. Pits impracticable.
43.00	Ascend a 25° slope.
50.00	Ascend steeper slope.
62.00	Summit, bears N&S. over ground Proceed nearly level along S. slope of hill.
73.95	Intersect E. bdy. of T. 29 N.R. 50 E. 73.00 chs. N of the cor of Tps. 28 and 29 N. R. 50 E. I set an andesite stone 20x10x8 ins, 15 ins in the ground, for the closing cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N. R. 51 E. marked CC 51 E on the E. 28N on the S and 29 N on the N. face, with 6 grooves on the N., S., and E. faces and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high E. of cor. Pits impracticable. Land. mountainous Soil, stony, 3rd. rate. Timber, sagebrush. Mountainous land, very steep 73.95 chains.

## Survey of Subdivisions of T. 28 N. R. 51 E.

July 22nd. 1909.

At 7 h. 4 m. AM. l.m.t. I set off 20° 22' N on the decl. arc and 40° 14' on the lat. arc and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 35, 36 1 and 2 on the S. bdy of T. 28 N. R. 51 E. Thence

I run N. on sectional guide meridian bet, secs. 35 and 36.
