Resurvey of Boundaries of T. 29 N. R. 51 E.

Chains.	of stone 3 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft base $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of cor. Now change course to N. 0o 3' W.
54.07	Draw. course SE.
70.00	Ridge, bears NE, and SW.
79.01	The old cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N. R's 51 and 52 E. A cedar stake lying in a mound of earth, with markings almost obliterated. I destroy all traces of the old cor and in the same place I set a rhyolite stone 16x12x6 ins. 11 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N. R's 51 and 52 E., marked 30 N on NE. 52 E. on SE., 29 N on SW. and 51 E on NW. face, with 6 notches on each edge; dig pits 30x24x12 ins. crosswise on each line, N.E. and W. 4 ft. and S. of stone 8 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth 5 ft base $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of cor. Land, rolling. Soil, sandy second rate. Timber, sagebrush. Rolling land, 99.01 chains.

At 7 h. AM. 1.m.t. I set off 9o 8' N. on the decl. arc, and 40o 20' on the lat arc, and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 25 and 36, on the E. bdy of T. 29 N. R. 50 E. Thence I run N. 6o 2' E. on the E. bdy of sec. 25.	
29.00	Ridge, bears NW. and SE.
34.50	Draw, course NE.
35.25	Nose of ridge, bears E. and W.
36.00	Draw, course SE.
39.00	Ridge, bears E. and W.
40.10	The old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. A rhyolite stone 8x6x4 ins. above ground marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. Change course to N.
45.00	Draw, course SE.
53.40	Ridge, bears SE. and NW.
