

Chains.

July 11, 1910.

I begin at the cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 22 and 23 E., Mt. Diabie B. and M., which is a basalt stone, firmly set in the ground, marked and witnessed and of the dimensions described by the Surveyor General.

Thence I run

W. bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Descending over mountainous land.

- 19.17 Rocky ridge, bears N.W. and S.E.
- 29.46 Broad ravine, course N.W. Begin ascending.
- 37.11 Ridge, bears N.W. and S.E. Begin descending.
- 40.00 Set a basalt stone 21-6-6 ins., 14 ins. in the ground for 1-4 sec. cor., marked 1-4 on the N. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 1-2 ft. high N. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- 46.10 Rocky ridge, bears N. and S. Continue descending.
- 55.60 Ravine, course N.W. Begin ascending.
- 59.50 Rocky ridge, bears N.W. and S.E. Begin descending.
- 80.00 Set a basalt stone 21-12-5 ins., 14 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, marked with 1 notch on the E. and 5 notches on the W. edge and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 1-2 ft. high W. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, rocky. 4th. rate.
- Vegetation, sagebrush and bunchgrass.
- Mountainous land, 80.00 chs.

W. bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Descending over mountainous land.

- 40.00 Set a basalt stone 22-11-5 ins., 15 ins. in the ground for 1-4 sec. cor., marked 1-4 on the N. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 1-2 ft. high N. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- Descend steep, rocky slope.
- 47.85 Ravine, course S.W. Descend along S. side of hill.
