General Description.

This township consists almost altogether of mountains and rolling land. The only portion under cultivation is about 50 acres in secs. 4 and 9, this is in meadow grass and is irrigated and cut for hay by the Gerlach Live Stock Company. Jesse Bryant, a equatter, also claims this meadow. In no other part of the township is there sufficient water to irrigate more than a few acres, although the numerous small streams and springs make it a well watered grazing country. The feed for grazing is good in all parts of the township. There are no mineral indications any place. The only timber is scattering mahogany thickets in the S.W. part, this is only good for firewood.
