A spring bears S 58° 20' W, 20.15 chs. dist.

A cabin bears S 33° 15' W, 6.90 chs. dist.

A small spring bears S 23° 35' W, 9.40 chs. dist.

The tent house of Albert Jenkins, a squatter contesting with the Gerlach Cattle Company for the possession of the meadow lands, bears N 82° E, 24.20 chs. dist.

N 0° 55' W bet. secs. 7 and 12.

Ascending flat ridge.

2.85 Road, bears E. and W.

16.90 Ridge, bears E. and W. Begin descending.

35.40 Ravine, course S.E.

41.12 The 1-4 sec. cor., a basalt stone, firmly set in the ground; marked, witnessed and of the dimensions described by the Surveyor General.

81.80 The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, a basalt stone firmly set in the ground; marked, witnessed and of the dimensions described by the Surveyor General. I destroy this corner and its accessories and reestablish it at the same point as follows;

Set a basalt stone 18-15-10 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 1 and 12, marked with 5 notches on the S. and 1 notch on the N. edge and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 1-2 ft. high W. of cor. Pits impracticable. Land, rolling.

Soil, rocky. 4th. rate.

Vegetation, sagebrush and bunchgrass.
