Chain July 18, 1911: At 7<sup>h</sup> 06<sup>m</sup> a. m., l. m. s., I set off 37°10' N. on the lat. arc, 21°12' N. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11

Thence I run

N. 0° 01' W. bet. secs. 2 and 3

Over level land, through shade oak and chaparral; ascend gradually along East side of Meadow Valley Wash.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkt. 53<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> | 52

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, N. of cor.

79.10 Intersect the Second Standard Parallel South 27, 13 chs. West of the St. cor. of secs. 34 and 35, which I established July 17, 1911

At my point of intersection

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3, with brass cap mkt.
