General Description

The major part of this township is compos-
 ed of rough, rolling land, the soil being either
 rocky or gravelly and rocky.

Along the ~~low~~ bottom lands of the Meadow
 Valley Wash, which traverses the eastern portion
 of the township from N. to S., the soil is sandy
 loam, and can be classed as agricultural, capable
 of producing good crops with irrigation. This
 is the only part of the township that is adapt-
 ed to farming.

Clarence Mayke, who is the only
 settler in the township, has about 20 acres
