

Subdivision of Fractional T. 7 S., R. 67 E.

- Chains meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12, on W. bdy. of Tp., set by me this a. m.
- Distance S. 89° 58' E., bet. secs. 6 and 7  
Over mountainous land, through scattering shadscale; ascend
- 5.00 Point of spur, 100 ft. abve sec. cor., projects S. 15° W.; descend rapidly
- 18.00 Gulch, 150 ft. below spur, dipitus S. 50° W., ascend abruptly
- 33.00 Spur, 250 ft. abve gulch, projects S. 60° W.; descend
- 39.20 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 mi. apart, 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap ink'd.

General Description.
