26.70 Mountain ridge, bears N and S.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft long, 1 in diam. 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor with brass cap mkd. -

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high N of cor.

61.10 Large ravine, course N. W.

100.18 Intersect the W. bdy. of the Tp. at N. $0^{\circ}20'E$. 3.15 chs. from the cor of secs 12 and 13, re-established by me June 5, 1911.

Set a basalt stone $7 \times 8 \times 33$ ins. 22 ins in the ground for closing cor. of secs 7 and 18, marked c.c. on E, with 2 grooves on N. and 4 grooves on S. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high E. of cor.

Land mountainous.

Soil rocky, 4th rate, covered with basalt rocks, loose and in place. Wholly unfit for cultivation.
