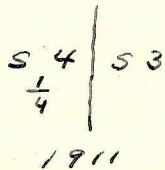

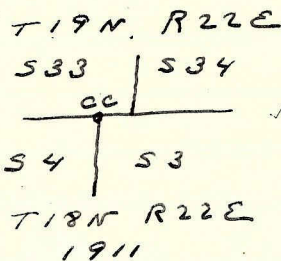
N 0 1' W on a true line bet. secs. 3 and 4

- 13.00 Mountain spur, slopes N.E.
- 24.15 Ravine, course N.W.
- 30.00 Mountain spur, slopes W.
- 36.97 Deep ravine, course W.
- 39.00 Small cliffs, bear E. and W.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam. 2 4 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with brass cap m'kd.

- 71.60 Mountain spur, slopes S.E.
- 77.50 Mountain spur, slopes N.E.
- 78.86 Intersect the N. bdy. of the tp. at
W, 1.62 chs. from the cor. of secs.
33 and 34, established by me June 1911.
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 in.
diam. 2 4 ins. in the ground for
closing corner of secs. 3 and 4
with brass cap m'kd.
