

Subdivision of T25N, R25E.

Chains.

November 15, 1911.

At the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the tp.; established by me Sept. 11, 1911, at 8 h., a.m., local mean time, I set off Co-Lat $50^{\circ}1'30''$ N. on the lat. arc, $18^{\circ}15'$ S. on the decl. arc, and determine a true meridian with the solar.

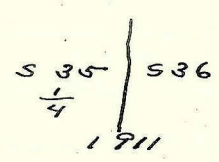
Thence I run

Over rolling granite mountains.

20.50 Ravine, course S.W.

29.70 Ridge, bears N.E. and S.W.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam. 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with brass cap mkt'd.



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of cor.

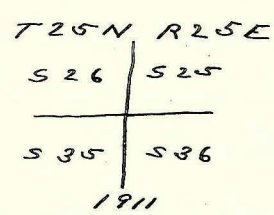
41.64 Ravine, course S.W.

50.60 Ridge, bears N.E. and S.W.

61.90 Head of ravine, course S.W.

78.15 Ridge, bears N.E. and S.W.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36; with brass cap mkt'd.



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, rolling granite mountains.

Soil; sandy, gravelly and rocky.

4th. rate. Unfit for cultivation.
