

SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T. 39 N., R. 26 E.

Chains

October 9, 1910: I again make a careful search for Tp. cor., but am unable to find any trace of old cor. I then retrace W. in Tp. 38 N., R. 25 E., along N. bdy. of sec. 1. At 40 and 80 chs. after making diligent search, I find no trace of old cors. I continue my line W. for 4 miles, and can find no trace of cors. set on N. bdy of T. 38N., R. 25E.

Oct. 10, 1910 I return to temp. Tp. cor., and retrace S. in Tp. 38N., range 25E. along the E. bdy. of Sec. 1. At 40 and 80 chs., after making a diligent search I find no trace of old cors. I continue my line S. for 3 miles, and can find no trace of cors. set on E. bdy. of Tp. 38N., R. 25 E.

October 10, 1910.

October 15, 1910: I return to the cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 26 and 27 E., and establish my random as a true line.

Thence I run.

W. bet. secs. 1 and 36., over ascending ground.

12.40 Top of small sand hill, 60 ft. above Tp. cor., bears N. and S., descend.

22.00 Foot of descent, 40 ft. below top of hill, thence over low rolling sand hills.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with brass cap mkd:

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and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.
