- 8.00 Head of draw, course S. 54° W.; asc.
- 17.00 Spur, projects S. 64° E.; desc.
- 39.50 Bottom of draw, course S. 77° E.; asc. south slope of mountain.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
