Resurvey of the W. bdy. T.41 N., R.26 E.

Chains

- 64.50 Sheep dipping tanks, 1 ch. S. of line.
 67.90 Fence, bears N. and S., leave sheep corral.
 68.40 Creek, 6 lks. wide, flows NW.
 Ascend NE. slope.
 85.50 Enter grove of quaking aspen.
 88.34 In grove of quaking aspen.
 The corner of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35.
 Having already repaired this corner, I do nothing further to it.
 Land, rough and rolling mountains of granite and volcanic rocks.
 Soil, rocky, 4th rate. Unfit for cultivation.
 Good growth sagebrush, some grass, some quaking aspen along the creeks and in small scattered groves.
 General northerly slope.
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- 4.00 S.89°44'W. bet. secs. 3 and 34.
 Ascending steep rocky NE. slope.
 Leave grove of quaking aspen.
 5.10 Ravine, course NE.
 38.50 High, rocky mountain ridge, bears NW. and SE., descend steep, rocky SW. slope.
 40.20 At this point, midway between the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, and the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34,
 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

 and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.
 80.40 On S.W. slope of mountains.
 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34.
 This corner being in good repair, I do not disturb it.
 Land, high, rough, rocky basalt mountains.
 Soil, rocky, 4th rate, wholly unfit for cultivation.
 Good growth sagebrush, little grass, quaking aspen
 On E. 4.00 chs., no other timber. E. 38.50 chs. slopes, N.E.
 W. 41.90 chs. slopes SW.
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- 8.50 S.89°44'W. bet. secs. 4 and 33.
 Descending rocky SW. slope.
 26.00 Ravine, course NW., ascend steep E. slope.
 Steep, rocky, round hill on line, 3 chs. across.
 Descend steep W. slope.
 47.50 Ravine, course N.
 52.00 Mountain spur, slopes NW.
 57.35 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
 I destroy all traces of this corner and its accessories and re-establish it at the same point as follows:
 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with brass cap mkd:

 and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.
 95.61 The cor. of secs. 32 and 33.
 Land, rough, rocky, volcanic mountains.
 Soil, rocky, 4th rate, wholly unfit for cultivation.
 Good growth sagebrush, little grass, no timber, general NW. slope.
