July 16, 1911: From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. Bdy. of Tp. here to fore described, in book of exteriors. I run.

N.  $0^{\circ}1'$  W., bet. secs. 35 and 36. ✓

Over descending ground.

6.40 Creek, 10 lks. wide, clear water. 5 ins. deep, course E. gradually ascend, along W. slope of hill.

43.27 Intersect State Line, between Nevada and Oregon. at N.  $89^{\circ}37'E$  22.69 chs. from the mile 209. which is a mound of earth and stone. 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, with a trap stone 24x11x4 ins. planted on top. marked on North face "O". on the South "N". on the East 209M. on the West 421. At point of intersection. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long. 2 ins. diam. 24 ins. in the ground <sup>for</sup> CC. of secs. 35 and 36. with brass cap mkd:
