

Soil, rocky; 4th. rate, wholly un-  
fit for cultivation. Mountains  
are composed of lime, granite,  
and eruptive rocks. Considerable  
float and mineral indications.  
Covered with a good growth  
of sagebrush, little grass, no  
timber.

### General Description.

The S. bdy; south of secs. 33 and 34  
is over rolling land, some of  
which would be very productive  
if it could be irrigated, but there  
is no water available for this  
purpose. S. of secs. 31 and 32 and  
the W. bdy; west of secs. 19, 30 and 31, the  
land is formed of high, rugged  
mountains of lime, granite and  
eruptive rocks, wholly unfit for  
cultivation. The line S. of secs.  
31 and 32 and W. of sec. 31 is across  
a well mineralized country; W. of  
secs. 19 and 30 there is not so much  
evidence of mineralization.
