From the cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28  
I now run S. on a blank line, re-  
tracing the line bet. secs. 27 and 28.

At 40.14 chs. I find the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.  
falling 46 links W. of my line. This cor-  
ner is a cedar stake  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam. by  
2 ft. above ground, firmly set in the  
ground in a mound of earth, and  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the W. face. At 80.15  
chs. I find the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33  
and 34, falling 70 links W. of my line.  
This corner is a cedar stake 2 ins. diam.  
by 2 ft. above ground, firmly set in the  
ground in a mound of earth. The  
markings are so nearly obliterated as  
to be undecipherable.

From the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and  
34 I now run E. on a blank line  
retracing the line bet. secs. 27 and 34  
at 40 chs. I search diligently but find  
no  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. At 80.30 chs. I find  
the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35 falling  
28 links S. of my line. This corner is  
a cedar stake 2 ins. diam., by  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft.  
above ground, firmly set in the  
ground in a mound of earth and  
stone. The markings are so nearly  
obliterated as to be undecipherable.

From the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35  
I run S. on a blank line retracing  
the line bet. secs. 34 and 35. At 40.00 chs.  
I search diligently but find no  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec.  
cor. At 78.24 chs. I find the cor. of  
secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35 on the S. bdy of the  
tp. falling 3.27 chs. E. of my line.  
This corner is a cedar stake 2 ins. diam.  
by  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. above ground, firmly set in  
the ground in a mound of earth  
and stone. The markings are so nearly  
obliterated as to be undecipherable.
